



Dahir Sulphur Pools

Distance 8.5km

Ascent 466m

Wadi Dahir located in the emirate of Fujairah is a beautiful and engaging hike. Thousands of years of rainfall has carved out this landscape into an intricate labyrinth of Limestone rock. It is named after the local village settlement called Dahir, but it is also referred to by the name of Waeab Al Hinna. It is named Dahir Sulphur Pools due to Sulfur like pools throughout the hike, which some are crystal clear blue water, and other pools which are snow white from lime residue.



The trek start is conveniently located alongside the E87 highway with plenty of parking. The trek follows the wadi north following beautifully built Cairns following single track, alongside sporadic pools in a steep-sided beautiful wadi. The first half of the hike has a very gradual and easy height Gain. Coming down the other side of the hike heading south, the landscape changes to a different, more dramatic wadi with some ups and downs, finishing with a beautiful view dropping back down into the wadi. An overall very rewarding and beautiful hike that is always changing. Difficulty would suit intermediate hikers, mainly due the length of time walking and the moderate Difficulty.
